Think About It!

1. Do you believe there are lies of the enemy in your life? Ask Holy Spirit to show them to you. If one comes up that you do not think is a lie, ask Him to begin to give you revelation about it and ask why it is a lie.
2. Have you been confronted with a contradiction in scripture? What was the conclusion, or have you studied it out. Write out what you discovered while studying on it. If you don't get an immediate answer, just continue to pray about it. Often the simplest answer is the correct one.

Now to Apply

Read your 'why' daily, even multiple times a day until it is in your brain. Purpose to make your quiet time important to your very survival and you will honor it. If you make it secondary, you will quit. Develop the habit and make the sacrifice to do it daily, even if it is only a few verses. Always ask Holy Spirit to open your mind and heart to the word and write down what you learn. You may be surprised how often you look back on it later.
